SCHOOL UNIFORM

As advised in late Term 3 a Sunnynook school uniform will be compulsory for all New Entrant students in Term 1 2010 and all Year 1-4 students in Term 3, 2010. The uniform is recommended for Year 5-6 students but not compulsory.

The School Uniform being introduced will be the one that was on display in the foyer over Term 3. Photos of the school uniform can be found on the school website www.sunnynook.school.nz. A price list is attached. Samples of the uniform will soon be available to try on for size. An order form will also be available shortly together with washing instructions.

Our uniform will be

Tops	- School polo shirt - School polar fleece sweatshirt
Optional	- School undershirt
Boys	- Shorts
Girls	- Cullotes (Girls have the option to wear the boys shorts above as these are a unisex fit)
Hat	- school labelled hat

Solid black flat closed toe shoes are to be worn in the winter. Sneakers can be worn provided they are solid black (no stripes, coloured logos or coloured shoelaces). Solid black flat sandals are to be worn in the summer, such as Roman or Velcro sandals. Socks are to be black or navy, either long or short are required

with winter shoes. Girls can wear black or navy tights in the winter. Shoes and socks are not available for purchase from the school and can be purchased from any shoe or retail store.

A school uniform helps encourage a pride in school and the development of a team and school spirit. The uniform identifies students as belonging to Sunnynook School. It is expected that all children's uniform items will be clearly named to establish ownership and to help with the return of misplaced items. The children will wear the uniform with pride, ie clean and tidy.
