BOOK WEEK

Our Book Week is coming up! Over the next week from Friday 25 June to Wednesday 30 June we will be having exciting activities at school. The events for the children are:

Friday 25 June **STU DUVAL**, the storyteller and cartoonist who will explain how he produces his large drawings during a story session – and the school gets to keep one of his illustrations. Stu Duval's books are suitable for Year 4-7 children, such as Achtung Pavlova, Deep Ark 6, Ride of the Katipo, Dusky Moana, and The Room of 100 Locks.

Monday 28 June **MOBILE LIBRARY** will be promoting the services of public libraries with children getting tours of the bus.
